Meeting Minutes

• **6:00 p.m. – Village Law Enforcement Meeting**

The Village Meeting was called to order by Chairman Brian Kammerud

Roll Call: Present: Brian Kammerud, Chuck Ellsworth and Billy McKusick. Absent: Kevin Kamish Also Present: Tiffany Grohn, Joe Cherewan, Autumn Hyden and surrounding residents

Proof of Posting and Notice: The agenda was posted at the Village Hall, Post Office and Village Website.

Agenda: A unanimous Chuck/Billy motion approved the agenda as prepared and presented.

Discussion: Discussion and possible action on ordinances pertaining to §153.16 Limitation on number of dogs. Surrounding residents were in attendance. Discussion on the clean, safe environment concerns, dogs getting loose, police reports, continuous noise issues and disruption due to continuous barking. Two residents stated that today alone the dogs were barking all day today. One of the residents stated that she cannot open her windows or sit outside because all you can hear is dogs barking, along with trash from the yard blowing into hers. Tiffany had stated she was not home today so she was not aware of the continuous barking. Tiffany stated she was not aware of the complaints from neighbors concerning this. Tiffany stated she is currently state licensed to Rescue, Broker and Breed License number 561231-DS. She would like to own between 4/5 breeding pairs of small breed dogs including Brussel Griffon, Yorkie, Maltese and Dachshund. She thought she was following Village Ordinances as she registered her dogs in 2022 and 2024, but must of slipped her mind and had forgotten to register the dogs the other years. She stated that if she doesn't have the renewal paper in front of her, she tends to forget.

A unanimous Chuck/Billy motion to deny the request for a multiple dog license based on discrepancies and disruptions to the surrounding village residents, non-compliance with consecutively renewing dog licenses prior to March 31 of each year and discrepancies in information provided. It is stated that Tiffany Grohn has 60 days to comply and rehome the dogs, along with license the maximum of 3 dogs with the Village Clerk. Any dogs under the age of 10 weeks may be kept until they hit their 10-week date. Failure to comply with the Village Ordinance and these terms will result in penalties stated in §153.21.

Adjourn: A unanimous Billy/Chuck motion approved to adjourn.
